

DUBLIN CITY COUNCIL UPDATES

Actions Taken by the Dublin City Council

December 1st, 2009

- An official funding request was adopted by the City Council to the Alameda County Congestion Management Agency (CMA) to finish the Alamo Canal Trail (note – this was approved by the CMA on December 3rd and the project will move forward in 2010-2011 fiscal year)
- Enhancements to the Kolb family home were approved as an enhancement to the Dublin Historic Park project
- The City Council expanded open space protections and lowered the density for the future Dublin Ranch North development from 68 houses to 4 estate homes. The Council also agreed to support the Lin family's annexation request to LAFCO
- Modifications were considered to multiple City ordinances to streamline the process to open Day Care facilities
- The City Council accepted a report from Dublin's Environmental Programs Committee and approved the formation of a Green Initiatives Task Force. The Task Force will consist of residents and business leaders, and their purpose is to advise the City on the creation and implementation of various environmental programs and policies
- Staff was directed by the Council to make improvements to its labor guidelines. Areas being examined include the monitoring of certified payroll records, pre-qualification of contracts, local hire provisions, use of apprentices on local projects, and PLA's
- Improvements to the median on Fallon Road near the Sports Park were approved
- Wells Middle School was recognized by the City Council for the 50% increase in recycling this year from their students and staff
- Axis Community Health recognized the City of Dublin for its support of the Womens' Health Clinic for low-income Tri-Valley residents
- Kasie Hildenbrand was re-appointed Vice Mayor and Jim Kohnen was re-appointed as Dublin's representative to the Alameda County Mosquito Abatement District
- Dublin Police Services and the Alameda County Fire Department gave presentations on their agencies public safety efforts for the Holidays
