

DUBLIN CITY COUNCIL UPDATES

Actions Taken by the Dublin City Council

February 16th

-A report was given on the feasibility of Dublin hosting a Farmers' Market. After reviewing the City's survey results and feasibility study, the Council conceptually agreed to move forward on a Friday night market bolstered with live entertainment and unique vendors at Emerald Glen Park. City Staff will now present our proposal to the Pacific Coast Farmers Market Association for their consideration. If our proposal is approved, the market will run from April through October starting in 2011.

-Rental policies were streamlined to allow easier rentals and use of the City's tennis courts and the Emerald Glen Picnic Area.

-Dublin will become a participant in the California First program to fund energy efficiency improvements. Residents can self-finance projects up to \$75,000 at a very low rate based upon the City's participation in the program.

-Our City's Smoking Pollution Control Annual Compliance Report was received by the City Council. All apartment complexes must comply with the ordinance requiring that at least 50% of the units be smoke-free by January 1st, 2011.

-The westernmost portion of Scarlett Court was sold to the owners of Dublin Honda for \$500,000 in cash payed over a three-year period, along with \$296,000 worth of improvements to the cul-de-sac at the eastern portion of the street near the entrance to the City's Maintenance Yard.

-The Dublin Unified School District gave a special presentation highlighting all of the construction projects taking place at Dublin High School and at various other school sites in the district as part of the Measure C School Bond.

-The City Council recognized Chris Cunningham for achieving his Eagle Scout Award and Pastor Napoleon Kaufman for being a recipient of a Bay Area Leadership Award for his work in the community.
