

DUBLIN CITY COUNCIL UPDATES

Actions Taken by the Dublin City Council

April 20th

-Modifications to the Sorrento East residential development were approved. The new project includes less units (581 instead of 684), with the vast majority of units being single-family detached as opposed to the previous project which was mostly a multi-family attached product. Also, the overall project is much less dense with more open space and larger private usable yards and pedestrian pathways. Enhancements were made to the neighborhood Passatempo Park and the community clubhouse, while the number of parking spaces were expanded. The project will maintain its Italian theme and high-quality architectural features

-As the new Historic Park gets closer to completion, the City Council decided to maintain the existing hours of operation and work with the Dublin Historical Preservation Association on efforts to raise over \$8,000 to fund the additional costs. The name chosen for the entire area was the "Dublin Heritage Park and Museums"

-Land use designations of "Business Park/Industrial and Outdoor Storage" were approved for the eastern and western portions of Scarlett Court that were recently vacated

-In order to better facilitate economic development, the City Council conceptually agreed upon parking modifications that would streamline the approval process and make it easier for shared parking between retail and office when the time of uses do not overlap

-The City Council reviewed the status and designations for its General Fund reserves in advance of the April 27th budget hearing

-Vice Mayor Hildenbrand and I are part of a sub-committee working with City Staff to raise funds to send a delegation to Kansas City for the All-American City Award Competition in June

-The City Council and Supervisor Haggerty formally recognized the Fallon Middle School Cheerleading Competition Team for winning Grand Nationals

-The Joint Powers Agreement merging Alameda County Transportation Improvement Authority and the Alameda County Congestion Management Agency was approved by the City Council

-A presentation was given on the upcoming Bike to Work Day events scheduled for May 13th
