DUBLIN, Calif., April 19, 2010 – The Rotary Club of Dublin will honor three city employees – Roger Bradley, Fire Engineer Lisa Feldman and Police Sergeant George Lytle – with their annual Superstar Award on Tuesday, April 20th at a special Rotarian lunch event at the Dublin Ranch Golf Course in Dublin.

The Award recognizes Dublin city employees and school district officials for their embodiment of Rotarian life, as well as other core values important to Rotarians. The Superstar Award criteria includes: leadership by example, ethics first (the Rotary 4-way test), openness to new ideas, and dedication to excellence.

Superstar Profiles

Roger Bradley is an administrative analyst in the City Manager's Office. Bradley is responsible for managing the City's newly formed Environmental Services Division and spearheading the City's Disaster Preparedness efforts. Bradley also is a guiding force in the City's annual Dublin Pride Week celebration. Roger has been chosen for this award because he truly exemplifies the Superstar Award criteria. He leads by example, is extremely ethical, is open to new ideas, and is dedicated to providing superior services to the organization and the community.

Bradley has worked for the City of Dublin for four years; and in that time, he has worked on a wide variety of projects that touch every part of our community. Before coming to work for the City, Bradley served his country as a United States Marine – training that served him well. Marines are noted for their dedication and their exceptional performances in tough situations. Bradley has risen to every occasion presented to him,

and this community has benefited from his service. Bradley has earned the respect and admiration of his fellow employees and the gratitude of the executive staff at the City of Dublin.

Lisa Feldman is a Fire Engineer with the Alameda County Fire Department working for the City of Dublin. Feldman has served the citizens of Dublin for the past several years and currently works out of Fire Station 16 on Donohue Drive. Fire Engineer Feldman is trained and qualified to operate some of the Department's specialized equipment and is a member of the Urban Search and Rescue Task Force IV and studying to promote to the rank of Captain in the future. She received this nomination and award because she consistently exemplifies the criteria of a "Superstar," leadership, ethics, openness, and dedication to excellence. Fire Engineer Feldman's colleagues know that they can count on her to be positive, helpful and always willing to lend a hand. She is an asset to the fire department and to the Dublin community.

George Lytle is a Sergeant for the Alameda County Sheriff's Office working for the City of Dublin. Sergeant Lytle is the Supervisor of the Special Investigations Unit. Through his leadership and organizational skills, he was able to run this operation with minimal amounts of overtime and for the first time in recent years, there were no reports of holiday related crimes in the commercial areas.
